Promoting Leadership in Health for African Nova Scotians (PLANS) at Dalhousie University is happy to be accepting applications for the **2017 African Nova Scotian Health Science Summer Camps**. African Nova Scotian students from across Nova Scotia who are interested in a career in health are invited to apply for this unique opportunity. The purpose of the camp is to increase interest in the health professions within the Black community. The camp will introduce youth to a variety of health professions through fun, hands-on and interactive programming. The camp will also consist of personal development, cultural and recreational activities such as African drumming, swimming and other outdoor activities. Youth can apply for one or all of the following summer opportunities:

- Halifax, Dalhousie University – July 9-14, 2017 (Grade 8, 9, 10)
- Sydney, Cape Breton University – July 18-21, 2017 (Grade 8, 9, 10, 11)
